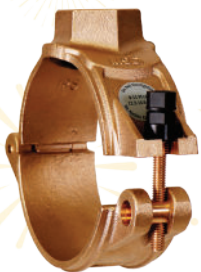

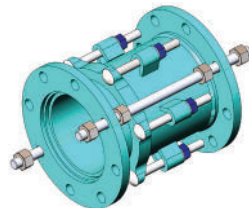

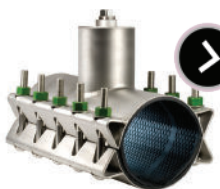

The nation's aging pipeline infrastructure requires constant updates to maintain reliable service. When a valve or flanged fitting is removed or replaced with a narrower one, a solution is needed to fill the extra space. The 309 Dismantling Joint provides that solution. This fabricated flange x flange fitting features a two-piece telescoping center section that collapses for installation and extends to span the gap between pipe flanges. Long time standard in the industry, demand has surged in recent years, with requests ranging from 3" to 54" sizes. With new equipment, JCM can now supply sizes up to 60" and beyond.



JCM Industries - 159 Abandoned Corporation Cap Sleeve



Replacing lead lines in aging water systems is a major task, especially in cities with decades-old infrastructure. In older cast iron systems, direct taps often leave abandoned corporation stops in place, which can leak and create water quality risks. The 159 Abandoned Corporation Cap Sleeve solves this by sealing the stop with a watertight gasket and bolted sleeve—an economical safeguard for system integrity. JCM recently introduced the Type 5 Sleeve, a narrower design with modified bolting for installation in tight spaces, rated to 250 PSI.

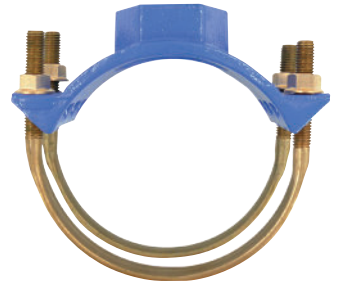
